Learn about Rockwell's *Four Freedoms* in order to think of a concept for your own piece.

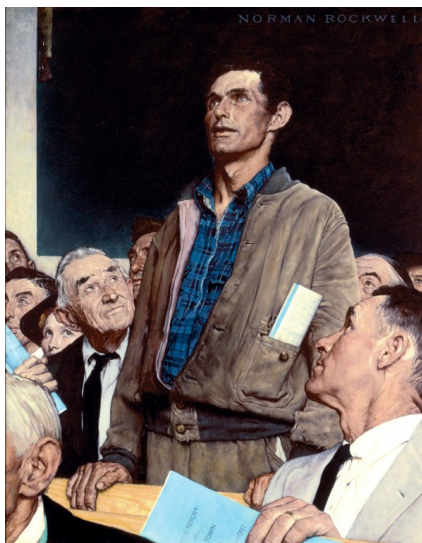
TECHNIQUE

Various methods of composition

INSTRUCTION

In January 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt addressed Congress about his vision for a postwar world founded on four basic human freedoms: freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear. In response and in hopes of bringing attention to the war effort, Norman Rockwell illustrated the four freedoms.

The *Four Freedoms*, traveled sixteen cities in a n exhibition that resulted in raising funds for the war. As you look at more examples of freedoms, think of your own personal freedoms and ways you can illustrate them in a piece.

Freedom From Fear (Left) & *Freedom From Want* (Right), 1943, Norman Rockwell

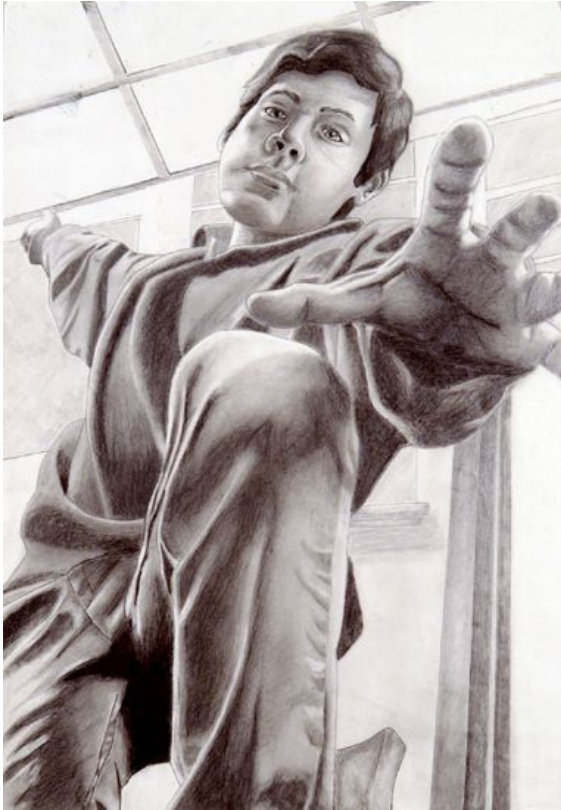
